## Innovation Award Eligibility

## To be recognized, a program:

- Must have been implemented a minimum of one year.
- Be well integrated into the organization's broader health and wellbeing initiative.
- Incorporate evidence-based elements of sufficient intensity to yield a population-based response (sometimes identified as a therapeutic dose); and
- Be supported by initial evidence of improvement in population health and noteworthy business results.

## **Innovation Award Criteria**

## The application must answer the questions:

- What was the innovation?
- What was its impact?
- How will it improve the overall health and wellbeing of the workforce?

### PROGRAM METRICS

- 1. Evidence-Based
- 2. Novelty
- 3. Sustainability/Scalability

#### **OUTCOMES**

- 4. Participation/Engagement
- 5. Health and Well-Being Outcomes
- 6. Business Outcomes
